### UnCommon Farms 2024 Winter Conference in Florida

A highlight of the week was the tour of the Metrolink Central Maintenance Facility. Metrolink is the first railroad in the U.S. to use 100 percent renewable diesel and has been fueling its 60 locomotives since February 2022. The trip was a very interesting experience for Reggie, and he was able to return home in time for some final preparations before planting season starts in full swing.
